

# IMPORTANT INFO

CAMP MANITOUMI IS AN ARM OF THE LOCAL CHURCH IN WHICH WE, HAVE MORE THAN 130 ACRES WITH HORSE AND HIKING TRAILS, TEAMWORK INITIATIVES, SPORTS FIELDS, AND A SWIMMING POOL. OUR CAMPGROUND INCLUDES NEWLY REMODELED CABINS WITH HEATING AND AIR AND RESTROOM/SHOWER FACILITIES, A LARGE HEATED AND AIR-CONDITIONED DINING HALL, ALL-SEASON RETREAT CENTER AND CABINS WITH BUNKS, AN INFIRMARY FOR THE NURSE, A RECREATION HALL WITH TABLE TENNIS, CARPETBALL, AND MORE, A CAMP STORE, AND A CANTEEN WITH YUMMY TREATS AVAILABLE. AT THE CENTER OF THE CAMP IS OUR HEATED AND AIR-CONDITIONED CHAPEL THAT SEATS UP TO 300. CAMP MANITOUMI WELCOMES CAMPERS FROM ALL FAITHS AND WALKS OF LIFE. ## YOUTH CAMPS

Registration begins at 10 a.m. on Monday and campers should be picked up at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday. No deduction is allowed for late arrival or early departure.

## FAMILY CAMPS

Family Camp Registration begins at 12 p.m. on Monday and ends after breakfast on Saturday. Labor Day camp starts at 5:00 on Friday and ends after lunch on Monday. No deduction is allowed for late arrival or early departure.

## WHAT TO BRING:

- Bedding (sleeping bag or sheets)
- Bible, pencil, notebook
- Toiletries (toothpaste, etc.)
- Clothes for Chapel that will not be used to play in. (no shorts)
- Clothes for play (include separate clothes that can get very muddy) Long pants and closed-toe shoes required for horse riding
- A one piece bathing suit
- A plastic bag for wet, dirty clothes
- Any necessary medication (must be turned in to nurse)
- Spending money for Chapel offering, crafts, camp store, snacks, soda, etc.

## OPTIONAL ITEMS:

Camera, stationary items, flashlight, water bottle, hat, postage stamps

## WHAT NOT TO BRING:

- Any electronic equipment. (mp3 players, game systems, cell phones, etc.)
- Any tobacco, alcohol, illegal drugs
- Any fireworks or weapons

## CODE OF CONDUCT

All campers are expected to:

- Cooperate fully with camp staff and leaders.
- Treat other people and their property with respect.
- Attend all services
- Not use inappropriate language and behavior.

The camp director and dean reserve the right to dismiss any camper whose conduct is detrimental to the overall good of the camp. In cases of misconduct, parent will be required to pick up camper and no refund will be made.

## DRESS CODE

All clothing should honor God. If you think it might be too low-cut, high-cut, see-through, cling-to, or questionable, don't bring it. Spaghetti straps, bare stomachs, questionable advertisements, and words across your backside are inappropriate. Shorts and skirts should be approaching the knee in length. No shorts in evening chapel. All swimming suits must be modest and one piece. Please be aware, a tankini is not considered a one piece suit. Guys and girls will sometimes swim together.

## HOMESICKNESS

Our counselors, nurse, and dean are all prepared to help your camper through any homesickness issues. We will keep you informed as necessary but do not permit campers to call home. After the first 24 hours there is no refund for campers who leave early due to homesickness. Remember that campers take their cue from you, parents. Prepare them ahead of time by encouraging them to make new friends, talk to counselors, etc. Try not to be nervous yourself, especially as you register your camper and leave him/her with his/her counselor.
